Access

- [Train] Higobashi Station on Osaka Metro Yotsubashi Line, 500 meters west from Exit 3
Watanabebashi Station on Keihan Electric Railway Nakanoshima Line, 400 meters southwest from Exit 2
Fukushima Station on JR Osaka Loop Line or Hanshin Railway, Exit 3
Shin-Fukushima Station on JR Tozai Line, 1 kilometer south from Exit 2
- [Bus] Alight at Taminobashi Bus Stop on Osaka City Bus Route 53 & 75, walk southwest 300 meters
- [Car] Parking for 60 cars (charges apply, priority given to reserved buses on weekdays)

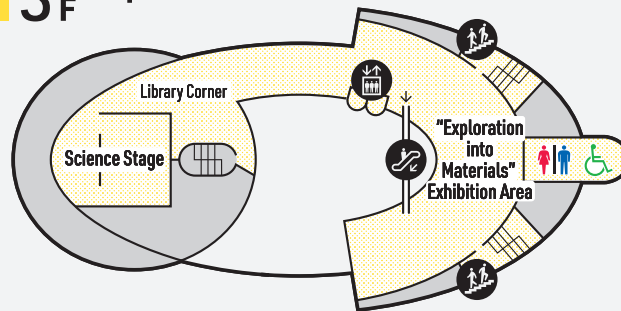


4F Scientific Exploration

3F Exploration into Materials

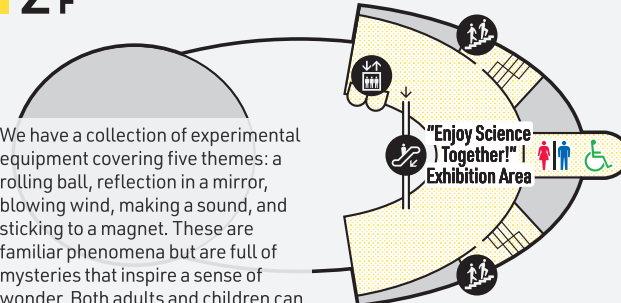

Science Stage

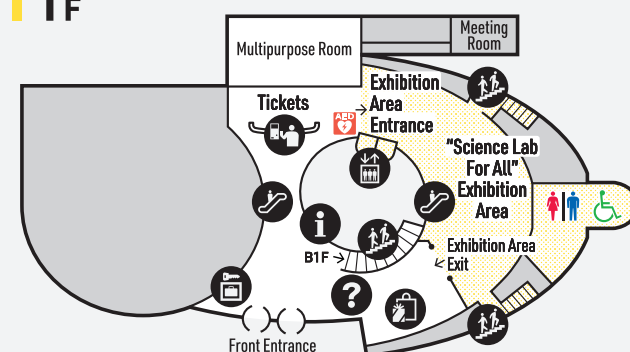
There are plenty of experiments for all ages. Solve the mysteries around us together!

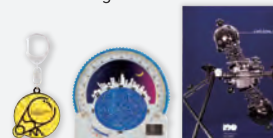

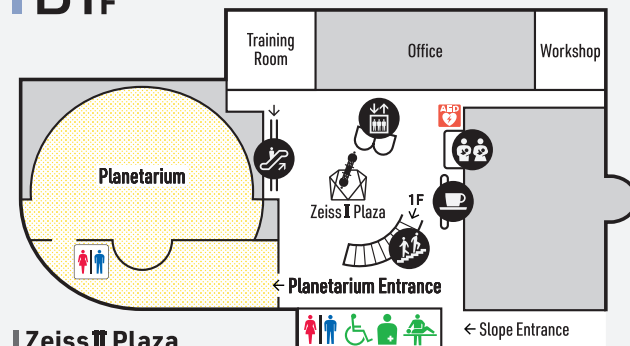

A variety of unique museum merchandise is on sale along with items you can use to enjoy science. Why not pick up something for a souvenir?

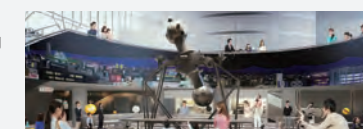


B1F Planetarium
